#### **Mastick Code of Conduct**

The Mastick Code of Conduct was introduced and adopted by the MSCAB on September 19, 2001 in an effort to ensure an enjoyable and consistent environment for all members participating in Mastick programs. Members are required to adhere to the Code when at the Center and participating in our programs.

## **MSCAB Scholarship Program Benefits YOU**

The Mastick Senior Center Advisory Board (MSCAB) Scholarship Program is funded by the MSCAB's fundraising programs and provides assistance up to 50% (not to exceed \$50) to members four times per year to offset the cost of Mastick classes, trips, and/or programs. Scholarship applications must be submitted at the time of program registration. Program registration assistance is available in the Mastick Office.

#### Be Present and Accounted For!

We track the number of participants attending classes to determine program popularity. To ensure our records are accurate, please sign your name on the roster in the:

- Lobby when visiting the Game, Media, and Coffee Rooms, as well as attending special events (e.g., Music Appreciation, Sing-Along with Keiko, etc.);
- Computer Room when using the Computer Lab or taking a computer class; and
- Pool Room when playing pool.

Instructors/Volunteers are requested to record the number of participants on the monthly Attendance Tally Sheet provided in the Social Hall, Skill Center, Media Room, Game Room, Dining Room 2, and Rooms A, B, D, and E.

If you are taking several classes, sign in at <u>each location</u> and for <u>each program</u>. Thank you for participating and helping to ensure that your favorite programs continue. Visit the Mastick Office for assistance or clarification.

#### **Senior Connections**

Senior Connections is a collaboration between Mastick Senior Center and Alameda Family Services to provide case management assistance for Alameda seniors needing help with health insurance, housing needs, in-home support services, food resources and so much MORE! The Case Manager is available on Tuesdays and Thursdays by appointment. To schedule an appointment, please call 747-7506.

#### **How to Evacuate Mastick Senior Center**

Should the need arise, we want you to be prepared to evacuate Mastick Senior Center while attending a class or program. Mastick Senior Center staff and class instructors are designated evacuation monitors. Each classroom is equipped with an evacuation map outlining the best route to exit the classroom you are occupying.

It is always best to be familiar with the classroom and your surroundings. When evacuating the premises, consider the following:

- Be aware of the evacuation map and review the evacuation route.
- Note that an addressable alarm system (fire alarm) was installed in 2005 and is designed to sound an alarm (bell) and alert Alameda's Central Dispatch of a fire at Mastick Senior Center.
- Exit the building via the exit closest to the street (e.g., Bay Street, Santa Clara Avenue, parking lot, etc.) and gather at the corner (Santa Clara and Bay or Santa Clara and St. Charles).
- Do not evacuate or congregate in the courtyard.
- Take personal belongings (e.g., purse, medication, etc.). However, DO NOT pack up craft projects.
- Inform Mastick staff and the Fire Department (during an actual evacuation) of participants needing special assistance evacuating the building.

Mastick Senior Center has many nooks and crannies that are available for our members to use as meeting spaces to interview a contractor or a caregiver. If you don't want to meet in your home, consider meeting at the Center. To reserve a meeting space, contact the Mastick Office at 747-7506.

#### **Brown Bag Program**

Eligible candidates must be 60 or older, with a gross monthly income of \$1,485 (single) or \$2,002.50 (families of two or greater). #### **City of Alameda Shuttle**

The Alameda Shuttle, funded by Measure B transportation sales tax dollars, is *free* and a great way to get around town. The shuttle is **open to the public**, yet its primary purpose is to connect seniors and individuals with disabilities with access to major shopping destinations and medical facilities around the City. Other passengers may ride the shuttle as space allows. The shuttle operates from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. #### **Mobility Matters—Volunteers Needed**

## **East Bay Paratransit (EBP)**

EBP is a public transit service for people who are unable to use AC Transit buses or BART trains because of a disability or a disabling health condition. Participants are transported from their place of origin to their desired destination in wheelchair equipped vans and sedans. EBP was established by AC Transit and BART to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements. For more information, call 287-5000.

#### **Alameda Paratransit Scholarship Program**

The City of Alameda, through Measure B funding, offers limited matching funds to assist with Premium Taxi Service and MRTIP expenses. Eligibility requirements apply. Applications are available in the Mastick Office.

#### City of Alameda Premium Taxi Service

Premium Taxi Service provides a 50% discount for taxi rides with a City of Alameda transportation provider. The service is not limited to medical trips. Participants must purchase required discount tickets in advance and are limited 20 coupons per quarter (every three months).

Eligibility requirements: Must be East Bay Paratransit certified or 70 years of age or older without a driver's license.

Cost: Each Premium Taxi Travel Voucher has a \$5 value and costs \$2.50. If the cost of a trip cannot be covered with one or more \$5 Premium Taxi Travel Vouchers, an additional travel voucher or cash may be used to pay the additional cost. Drivers are prohibited from providing change. Participants must present the driver with a completed Travel Information Form upon arrival at the requested destination. ## **Housing Rehabilitation Programs**

The City of Alameda sponsors several rehabilitation programs providing loans, grants, and/or technical assistance to homeowners. Assistance is available to repair housing stock for low and moderate-income residents, correct code deficiencies, or perform minor emergency home repairs. #### **Rent Review Advisory Committee (RRAC)**

The RRAC reviews complaints of significant rental increases, providing a neutral forum for renters and residential property owners to present their views. It evaluates increases, determines whether they are equitable, and, if not, attempts to mediate a resolution acceptable to all parties.

The RRAC does not provide legal advice. Each landlord and tenant is responsible for seeking the advice of legal counsel on any matter(s) or document(s) related to their specific circumstances. The Committee's recommendations are not legally binding. For more information, visit www.alamedahsg.org.

#### 2% Utility Users' Tax (UUT) Exemption

Alameda residents, 62 years of age and older or low income, are eligible for a 2% exemption on the UUT for the following utility services: electrical, gas, and cable services. Residents can benefit from the 2% reduction or can designate the cost savings as a restricted gift to fund Mastick Senior Center programs. In 2015, Mastick Senior Center received \$2,281.68 for programs as a result of residents designating their cost savings to the Center. UUT Exemption forms are available in the Mastick Lobby and Office.

#### **Program Refund Policy**

The Alameda Recreation and Park Department Refund Policy is as follows:

- If a client requests a withdrawal and/or transfer from ANY class or program before the start date, there is an automatic \$15 administrative fee.
- After a class begins, withdrawal and/or transfer requests are charged an automatic \$15 administrative fee and will be prorated based on the number of classes that have already passed in the session.
- The remaining funds will only be applied to your account as a credit to use for a future enrollment.
- Please note that certain programs (e.g., Mastick Trips\*) have different refund policies.
- There are no refunds/credits/make-ups allowed for any classes you miss.
